

Ian Elmore is a conductor of LYO's Repertory Orchestra. Elmore has conducted the University of Louisville, Ball State Symphony Orchestra, Pierre Monteux Festival Orchestra, and the Muncie Symphony Orchestra. He has appeared as a guest clinician with multiple young orchestras as well, including but not limited limited to Floyd Central High School Orchestra and the Youth Symphony Orchestra of East Central Indiana.. Additionally, Elmore founded his own orchestra, the Alunos Chamber Orchestra, at the age of twenty and conducted the music of Beethoven, Schubert, Mendelssohn, and Haydn, among other composers.

As a bassist he has performed with multiple orchestras including the Paducah Symphony Orchestra, the Muncie Symphony Orchestra, the Villages Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. Ian has served as principal bassist of the Hot Springs Music Festival, Pierre Monteux Music Festival, and the Sewanee Summer Music Festival. A champion of new music, he has also performed in multiple new music ensembles, both with universities and professionally. He has given multiple world premiers of solo bass works. As a bass teacher, he has experience teaching privately, as well as in the masterclass or sectional setting.

Elmore has studied conducting with Kimcherie Lloyd, Douglas Droste, and Michael Jinbo. He has studied double bass with Karl Olsen, Sid King, Joel Braun, and Ju-Fang Liu. In addition to conducting and double bass, Elmore has also experienced success as an operatic tenor.

Doug Elmore Music Director

Doug Elmore brings to the podium over thirty-five years of outstanding musical leadership in the Midwest. Mr. Elmore is in his 36th year as Orchestra Director of the Floyd Central High School Orchestra and the Highland Hills Middle School Orchestras, instructing 5 orchestras and over 350 students daily. In addition to his duties with the Floyd County schools, Mr. Elmore recently served as Music Director of the Floyd County Youth Symphony (IN) for 24 years. He has been with the LYO for the past 9 years, 3 with the Repertory Orchestra. A graduate of DePauw University (IN), Mr. Elmore completed his graduate work at the University of Louisville in 2001. As a performer on the double bass, Mr. Elmore has worked with the Louisville Orchestra, Actors Theatre of Louisville, Derby Dinner Playhouse, the Jerry Tolson Quartet, the Ron Jones Quartet, the Mike Tracy Trio, the Platters, and the Sarah Stivers Quartet. Mr. Elmore has been featured on jazz recordings by University of Louisville faculty members Jerry Tolson and Mike Tracy. In 2020, he was selected as Indiana's "Music Educator of the Year" by the Indiana State School Music Association. In 2011, he was selected as Floyd Central High School's "Teacher of the Year." He was recognized by the ASTA as Indiana's High School Orchestra "Teacher of the Year." He has been awarded an Eli Lilly Endowment "Teacher Creativity Fellowship." He has been recognized with a WHAS TV ExCel Award for "Excellence in the Classroom and Educational Leader."
